# Public Reporting Requirements—MHDO & MQF

Title 22 Chapter 1683 §8712-Maine Health Data Organization (MHDO) Title 24-A Chapter 87 §6951-Maine Quality Forum (MQF)


The Maine Health Data Organization, in collaboration with the Maine Quality Forum, is required by law to promote the transparency of healthcare cost and quality information via a publicly accessible website.



Both agencies are independent State agencies governed by multi-stakeholder boards of directors that include representatives from payers, providers, employers, government, consumers, and hospitals.



- CompareMaine was launched in October 2015 with financial support from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS)
- This site was developed by the Maine Health Data
  Organization in partnership with the Maine Quality
  Forum and the Human Services Research Institute,
  NORC and Wowza.
- It allows users to compare the costs of over 200 medical procedures and three quality measures at more than 150 Maine health care facilities





- Facilities: Hospitals, Clinics, Ambulatory Surgical Centers, Labs, and Imaging Centers
- Procedures Categories: Office Visits, PT and OT, Mental & Behavioral Health Services, OB/GYN, Radiology & Imaging, Lab Services, Surgical Procedures
- Payers: Aetna, Anthem, CIGNA, Harvard, Community Health Options
- Quality Measures: Patient Experience, Preventing Serious Complications, Preventing Health care Associated Infections (MRSA and C. Diff)

### here's what you can find on CompareMaine:

#### health care procedures

Over 200 are listed – from childbirth to knee replacement surgery to blood tests.

#### costs

The amount the facility typically gets paid by the insurer including member cost sharing for a medical procedure.

#### insurers

See the average payments made by the top five insurers (including consumer payments) to facilities. Cost data are not included for MaineCare (Medicaid) or Medicare.

#### patient experience


Facilities are rated by their patients on their overall experience and quality of care.

#### complications

Facilities are rated on their ability to prevent serious complications.

#### infections

Facilities are rated on how well they keep patients safe from infections.

### Challenges

- Raising awareness about the site
- Managing expectations
- Encouraging participation and buy-in from facilities and payers
- Identifying new areas for updates and improvements
- Maintaining interest
- Maintaining the website keeping up to date with the most relevant information, as needs and information availability change



### CompareMaine 2.0 – June 2016

- Updated cost and quality data
  Update cost data by 6 months to July 1, 2014 Sept. 30, 2015
- Updated quality data
   Based on national updates in April
- Enhanced procedure search functionality
   To increase flexibility of search parameters
- Added additional procedures
   Colonoscopies, digital mammograms, and few high-volume labs

### CompareMaine 3.0 – November 2016

Will include quality data updates


Cost data updates postponed until 4.0 due to data delays resulting from Gobielle decision
