ProPublica Cancer Volume Process

- Pro-Publica approached NAHDO after seeing the CA OSHPD website to see if NAHDO could spearhead an effort to get other states to run the same SAS program http://www.oshpd.ca.gov/hid/cancer-surgery-report.html
- NAHDO-ProPublica webinar in February 2017 (over 15 states participated) to inform them of the project and opportunity to talk with OSHPD staff
- NAHDO sent out a Packet (see next slide)
- States requested the SAS tool (seven states requested this to date)
- Two maybe three have sent data to ProPublica

What we heard from states

- States that sent data to Propublica
 - Was simple, good report for their use
 - MOU needed to be signed by ProPublica—this took a long time
- States that requested SAS tool but not sent data
 - Waiting for ICD-10 version
 - Vendor won't run the code (not part of contract) and do not have internal capacity
- States that did not request
 - Board won't let them
 - Don't have resources
 - Will wait until ICD 10 code made available

From ProPublica....

- Frankly, our research/analysis with the Sloan Kettering team is taking longer than I initially anticipated
- I also worry that data through Q3 2015 may seem out of date by the time we publish.
- I wonder if we should make another push with ICD10, as you suggest.
- I also wonder how we'd display it with only five states.
- I think we're onto something here. And when you look at the states that have shared their data, what you see is tremendous variation that the public deserves to know about.
